Spring Lecture 14 April 2016—The Late Medieval Abbot.

More than 90 people braved a wet April evening to attend the lecture given by Dr Martin Heale, from the University of Liverpool. The venue was St Laurence church, which is rarely open nowadays.



The lecture was preceded by a short guide to the church monuments from our President, Professor Brian Kemp. The church contains some fascinating monuments including John Blagrave, a famous 17th century mathematician, and a mural monument in painted alabaster to Martha daughter of Thomas Seakes of Henley on Thames (pictured).

Martha, wife of Charles Hamley 'of Cornwall' died 1636.



We are extremely grateful to Dr Heale for a very entertaining illustrated lecture, that drew such a large audience. It was also a pleasure to get back inside St Laurence's church, which was part of the Medieval Abbey precinct, built as a place of worship for the townspeople.

Abbey Quarter Update

Reading Abbey Revealed Project Following the news of the grant award, the procurement of the main contractors will start in spring; and in the summer, procurement for the consultant for the interpretation implementation work will begin. Contracts will be awarded to the successful applicants in the autumn. Work on site will include the stabilisation of the ruins, and landscaping and restoration of the Abbey Gate. Interpretation work across the Abbey

Quarter will tell the story of the different aspects of history and link up the various historic buildings and monuments around the Quarter through directional signage and interpretation panels. Work on site will begin in the autumn and it is hoped this will be complete by spring/summer 2018.

Hidden Abbey Project—extract from Reading Borough Council's Press Release, April 2016

The Hidden Abbey Project involves Reading Borough Council, the RC Diocese of Portsmouth and the Ministry of Justice, as the principal public landowners in the Abbey Quarter site, together with the Friends of Reading Abbey, Darlow Smithson Productions and Philippa Langley of Little Marilyn Productions Ltd.

The project is being taken forward by a Steering Group on which all of the above organisations are represented. Reading Borough Council will be the commissioning body for works associated with the project, although it will not itself provide any funding directly. The Hidden Abbey Project Steering Group is in the process of awarding the tender for the GPR surveys, with a decision expected during May.
